SECTION 4: First aid measures

- · 4.1 Description of first aid measures
- General information:

Immediately remove any clothing soiled by the product.

Symptoms of poisoning may even occur after several hours; therefore medical observation for at least 48 hours after the accident.

Ways of exposure: Skin contact. The substance may be absorbed into the body by inhalation, ingestion and through the skin. Formation of product mist when applied by spray, which could be inhaled.

Hazards identification: The substance is flammable. The substance is harmful by inhalation and is irritating to eyes and respiratory system. High concentrations will cause narcotic effects. Repeated exposure may cause skin dryness or cracking.

After inhalation:

Supply fresh air. If required, provide artificial respiration. Keep patient warm. Consult doctor if symptoms persist.

No adverse effects are anticipated from inhalation.

Fresh air. If person feels unwell seek medical advice.

· After skin contact:

Immediately rinse with water.

Treat with a suitable cleaner and wash afterwards with water and soap. If irritation persists seek medical advice.

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· After eye contact:

Rinse opened eye under running water. If symptoms persist, consult a doctor.

7.1 Precautions for safe handling

Ensure good ventilation/exhaustion at the workplace.

The dried resin is combustible, similar to wood. Burning dry resin emits dense, black smoke. As latex, material is not combustible.
